Fair Premium Books are available for purchase at the Fair Office. This is year two of the two year book.

Fair entry procedures remain the same as last year. Points to consider:

- On-line entries will be available by the end of April.
- Entries close June 16 at 11:59 PM.
- Leaders will be asked to cross check club members' entries with projects in which youth are enrolled at the June Sr. Leaders' meeting. Those not completed at that time will need to be reviewed before July 7 at the UW-Extension office. Printouts will be available.
- Corrections must be made directly with the Fair Office before 5pm, July 14.
- Entry tags will be available at the July Senior Leaders' meeting. Fair staff will be present to accept payment for a club's tags. All remaining tags must be picked up at the Fair Office.

Mixer: Laura VanderVeen, general leader of Sharon 4-H, guided the leaders in an activity about places in the county, reminding all that youth come from various “corners” and the need to know where places are located.

Robin Gleason, UW-Extension Intern, introduced herself and talked about state fair opportunities available to youth and scholarships for older youth.

Unfinished Business:

- House of Pork: Sign-up is available online. Central District has the May Flea Market. All were reminded they can help at any of the Flea Markets. Northwest District is not assigned a Flea Market so members and leaders are asked to assist other districts.
- Drama Fest: Clubs with Cloverbuds interested in participating or who have members who wish to join with a group outside of their club are encouraged to contact Caroline Cornelison or Jeff Kleist.
- Thank you to Linda Giorno for facilitating Leader Training. Linda and Awards Committee members will also help with the Records Training on April 11.
- Congratulations to Quentin Cauffman, 4-H Alumni, who earned 11 All-American Awards while a member of the Ohio State University Shooting Team. Thanks were shared by the family for the support shown by the 4-H program.

New Business:

- Six youth (3 from Whitewater 4-H, 2 from Spring Prairie 4-H, and 1 from Sharon 4-H) who will be attending State Conference, Madison, in June, told the group of the goals they hope to accomplish by attending the Conference. Remaining applicants will be at the April meeting. Funding (1/3 of the cost) for the 11 selected youth was approved. (Linda Giorno, Nancy Lee motion)
- An effort will be made to clarify who needs to complete the Fund Finder Form prior to requesting financial help with a trip.
- Clubs are encouraged to consider operating the Pre-Fair Judging Week Food Stand in August as Sugar Creek 4-H will not be doing this activity.
- Seven youth plan to go on the Mystery Trip (May 5-7) and will assist with their fund-raising spaghetti dinner on April 23 (4-7pm) at the fairgrounds. A Mystery Trip for seventh-ninth graders may be scheduled for July.
- House of Pork—Help is needed for grilling and Saturday preparations for Flea Markets. Dan Morgan has agreed to assist with the grilling. Consideration is also being given to serving grilled chops at the fair if there is room by the trailer and enough staff to man the grills. All were reminded we will be in a different location. Letha Kuecker will have signs made and placed in the 4-H Building to help direct fair visitors to the House of Pork.
- Fur and Feather Swap Day will be held April 15 at the Fairgrounds.

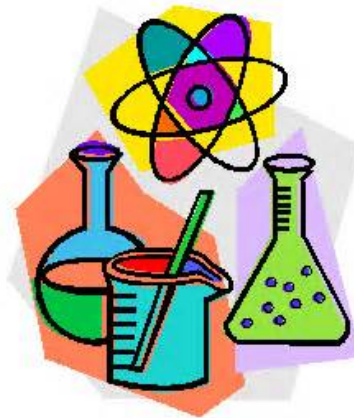

The Walworth County Junior Leaders' Association met on March 27, 2017 at the County Government Center. This meeting followed a joint session with the Senior Leaders' Association during which pledges were said and members heard a presentation from Lillie Cauffman asking for financial support for her trip to CWF this summer.

Amelia Hayden led an ice breaker for the Junior Leaders' just prior to the start of their meeting. The Junior Leaders' Association meeting was called to order by Braden Kundert at 7:20 p.m. The Secretary's Report was given by Lillie Cauffman. It was approved by Leo Ehlen and seconded by Brandan Constable. Motion carried. The Treasurer's Report was then given by Braden Kundert who said there was a balance of \$22,281.80 in checking and a CD balance of \$6,229.96. Ben Bartlett moved to approve the Treasurer's Report; Conner Hessman seconded it. Motion carried. In the UWEX Report, Debbie spoke about the *Family Records Training*. Also, there was a *4-H Camp* report given by Lillie Cauffman, Conner Hessman, Leo Ehlen, Amelia Hayden, and Claire Schilz. This brought us into a camp promotion opportunity given to every club within the county to promote camp to their club and allow them to participate.

We then voted on state conference scholarships that we will be giving out to the 11 people going. Conner Hessman moved to approve a \$75 scholarship for each person and Brandan Constable seconded it. The motion carried. Next meeting will be Science Night. Workshop volunteers included: Connor Hessman, Haileigh & Kylie Chipman, and Brandan Constable. Ben Bartlett is signed up to lead the icebreaker. Club reports were then given. Linn 4-H held an international fair; Conner Hessman and Braden Kundert shared what all happened at it. We then were given an opportunity to share other experiences 4-H has to offer with our 4-H clubs with this month's *Clover Trip Tik* handouts telling about 4-H scholarships and state fair activity station leaders. We also were given a flier for the IW2K STEM camp that the state hosts. The meeting was adjourned by Claire Schilz and seconded by Becca Wells. After the meeting, members participated in four different member-led workshops (Hunting, Fishing, Wildlife, and Birds). Then, the group ate nachos for refreshments.
