Fair Entry Wrap-up

Remember that junior fair entries are being handled a little differently than they have been in the past. During the June Senior Leaders' Association meeting, 4-H leaders will be asked to compare the entries of each of their club members against the projects they signed up for in 4-H. Any leaders who are unable to attend on June 27 will need to complete this task by the end of the day on July 8 in the UW-Extension office. Club leaders will NOT need to do an on-line review of members' entries this year.

Fair entry tags will be made available for pick-up at the July 25 Senior Leaders' Association meeting. Because clubs must make payment at the time of entry tag pick-up, fair office staff will be present that night to receive payments. Any tags not picked up on July 25 must be picked up in the Fair Office during regular business hours.

Graduate Recognition

4-Hers who are high school seniors or college freshman this program year and who plan to graduate from 4-H at the end of September will be honored on as part of the July 25 Joint Association meeting between 6:30 and approximately 7:10 p.m. Potential graduates were contacted directly by the UW-Extension office this year. All 4-Hers who just completed their first year of college will be recognized along with any 4-Hers who graduated from high school this year and expressed the intent to discontinue 4-H membership. A cake/punch reception will happen as part of the ceremony.

New 4-H Club Award Application Now Ready

The 4-H Awards Committee is pleased to announce a new award which will be given beginning this fall. The *Walworth County 4-H Meeting Excellence Award* is designed to honor one 4-H club annually for outstanding efforts to create a fun, welcoming monthly meeting environment through the active engagement of members. Clubs are invited to submit one application annually to document all of their related efforts. The form is due to the UW-Extension office no later than the end of the September Senior Leaders' Association Meeting. It is the intent that at least one youth and adult club representative will work cooperatively to complete the application, though neither is required to be an enrolled "leader." The winning club will have its name engraved on a traveling trophy donated by Ginny Hall. Pending approval at the June Senior Leaders' Association meeting, the winning club will also receive a "Treat Party." The award application will soon be available on the UW-Extension website and a hard copy is being provided in each club's mailbox.

The 7 Out of State Exchange members and Nancy Lee will be heading out Pennsylvania on Friday.


