Following the presentation, four youth who attended Space Camp shared information about their experiences and thanked the group for their assistance with funding. Jack and Cole Flitcroft shared information about qualifying for the National Shooting Sports Competition and asked for financial assistance for this trip.

Junior Leaders were excused to their own meeting.

The Senior Leaders' meeting opened with the flag pledges, followed by the approval of the minutes of the April meeting. The treasurer's report, prepared by Kristi Plenty, was reviewed and approved as printed. During the past month a thinking of you card was sent to Bob Arnold, (leader and supporter of the Shooting Sports program), a sympathy card to leader Betty Baerwald, and flowers and a card to Diane DeBaere on the passing of her mother.

UW Extension Report (Chelsea Dertz):

Significant upcoming dates and deadlines include Fair entries deadline, June 16; 4-H Camp June 21-24; Fair Entry cross checks due in Office July 7; and the Fair Entry Correction Deadline July 14.

A "Meet the Counselor Night" will be held on May 30 for camp families who would like to meet the counselors before going to camp. Due to a flea market at the fairgrounds, returning campers will be dropped off in the south parking lot of the 1887 Building.

A State Conference Orientation meeting will be held on June 13.

Youth and adults interested in helping at the Pork Shoppe during Wisconsin State Fair should contact Debbie Burkman to get signed up.

Clubs were reminded of the "June is Dairy Month" window display contest. Pictures and an entry form are due in the UW-Extension Office by June 2. Judging will be on June 13, with winners announced in the Newsclip and 4-H Website.

Unfinished Business:

- Eight youth participated in the Mystery Trip to Grand Rapids and Holland, Michigan.
- The annual recognition banquet will be held November 5 at First Lutheran Church. It will begin later to give State Forum participants adequate time to get back. Linda Giorno asked that club pictures be sent to her as well as to the paper for their annual insert.

New Business:

- Twenty-six youth participated in the recent Communication Arts Fest. There were 42 entries.
- House of Pork had a successful day at the first Flea Market although attendance decreased earlier than usual due to the change in the weather. Financials will be available at the next meeting.
- All were reminded about the on-line sign-ups for the House of Pork work times during the Walworth County Fair as well as for the supervision times in the Youth Building. The schedule should be ready by the July meeting.

- A reminder was given that any youth participating in out of county events is required to help in the House of Pork at one of the Flea Markets in order to get financial assistance for their event.
- Representatives of the Southeast and Northeast Districts met after the regular meeting to set a date for the Cloverbud/Exploring Workshop.
- Linda Giorno, Awards Committee representative, reminded all of the graduation planned prior to the July Leaders' meeting. Club leaders were asked to advise the office of the youth in their club who are graduating as well as how many will be attending that event.
- Non-animal entries for state fair will be accepted before the June Senior Leaders meeting.
- Elkhorn 4-H had a program presented by Vets Roll, organizers of trips to Washington, D.C. for WWII and Korean Vets.

May 22, 2017

The Walworth County Junior Leaders' Association met on May 22, 2017 in the County Government Center. The Junior Leaders' meeting was called to order by President Braden Kundert at 7:55 pm following the joint meeting with Senior Leaders where Space Camp attendees presented and Jack and Cole Flitcroft requested funding for their upcoming National Shooting Sports trip. We also had a presentation about leadership by presenter Carl Olson (Energizer Olson). Brandon Constable led the pledges.
