



WALWORTH COUNTY 4-H CAMP 2018 FACT SHEET



Walworth County 4-H Camp is where youth travel to Upham Woods Outdoor Learning Center in the Wisconsin Dells to live and play for three days and three nights. Campers are assigned to “cabins” where they live with other campers their own age and gender. Each cabin consists of approximately ten campers and is supervised by trained high school and college age 4-H counselors—many of whom are past campers themselves. Additionally, the University of Wisconsin Extension Walworth County 4-H Youth Development staff, the Upham Woods staff, and several screened adult 4-H chaperones oversee campers the entire time they are present. The adult to youth ratio at 4-H Camp is 1:10 in compliance with Wisconsin 4-H policy. Camp registration fees remain low after many years due to the generous financial support of our Walworth County Junior and Senior Leaders’ Associations.

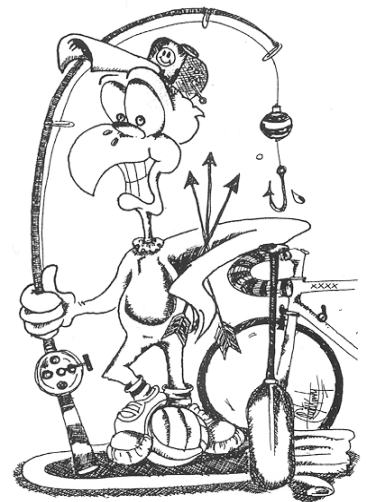
ACTIVITIES

Each day of camp is divided into several different activity sessions and evening camp-wide activities which are planned and conducted cooperatively by the 4-H camp counselors, 4-H staff, adult chaperones, and camp staff. Typical daily activities include:

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| Swimming | Arts & Crafts | Field Games |
| Nature Hikes & Study | Canoeing | Fishing |
| Team Building | Archery | Science |
| Water Games | Challenges | Skits and Songs |

Evenings at camp include things like:

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| Campfires | Dramatic Presentations |
| Special Workshops | Recreational Challenges |
| Hikes | Snacks |
| Dances | Outdoor movies |



WHAT ABOUT SAFETY?

There is a qualified camp nurse on-call at camp at all times. All water and watercraft activities are supervised by certified lifeguards. Campers’ whereabouts are known and checked at all times. If there is any illness or accident, the family is contacted immediately. Except in emergency situations, campers and counselors are not allowed to make or receive phone calls. Additionally, campers are not allowed to have cell phones during camp. Both calls to/from home and use of social media tend to cause homesickness both for the campers engaging in them and those simply observing.

WHO CAN ATTEND 4-H CAMP?

Walworth County 4-H Camp is open to Walworth County 4-H Club members who are in grades 3-8 (as of Jan. 1 of the current 4-H year). Camp is designed to help campers develop and strengthen their social, intellectual, and physical skills. Camp counselors must be currently enrolled 4-Hers who will be at least 15 years old by the start of camp.
